The Consolidated Plan is a road map for the use of Brazoria County's U.S. Department of HUD funding for the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), HOME Investment Partnership (HOME), Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG), and Section 8 Housing Choice Voucher (HCV) programs through 2024 for areas outside of the City of Pearland. The City of Pearland receives its own CDBG funds and HUD does not allow County CDBG, HOME, ESG funds to be expended in Pearland. Section 8 HCVs may be used within Pearland. The 5-Year Plan focuses on serving lower-income residents and neighborhoods.

We want to hear from as many residents and stakeholders as possible about your perceptions of the County's needs, goals, strategies and resources for the use of HUD funds.
