DISTRICT ATTORNEY—TOM SELLECK

After Jeri Yenne retired on October 1, 2020, Governor Greg Abbott appointed Tom Selleck as the Brazoria County Criminal District Attorney for a term set to expire on December 31, 2022. Tom Selleck is an Angleton attorney and owner of The Law Office of Tom Selleck, P.C.. Additionally, he is a deputy sheriff for the Brazoria County Sheriff's Department, a member of the State Bar of Texas, Texas Criminal Defense Lawyers Association, The Federalist Society, and the Brazoria County Bar Association. Tom is the chairman of the Angleton Area Emergency Medical Corps Board of Directors, board member of the Women's Center of Brazoria County, and a life member of the Brazoria County Fair Association. Mr. Selleck received a Bachelor of Science in Criminology from Florida State University and a Juris Doctor degree from South Texas College of Law. Brazoria County is proud to have Mr. Selleck serving as our District Attorney.

This 4-year term, elected position has the following responsibilities:

- Represents the state in prosecuting felony criminal cases
- Works with law enforcement officers in the investigation of criminal cases
- Presents cases to the grand jury
- Represents victims of violence in protective orders and represents the state in removing children from abusive households

Requirements for running for District Attorney:

- U.S. Citizen
- Resident of Texas for at least 12 consecutive months
- Resident of the district for at least 6 consecutive months
- Not have been finally convicted of a felony from which they have not been pardoned or otherwise released from the resulting disabilities
- Registered to vote in the district
- Practicing lawyer or judge
- At least 18 years of age
- Not have been determined by a court with probate jurisdiction to be totally mentally incapacitated or partially mentally incapacitated without the right to vote
