Pursuant to Rules 304 and 309 of the Texas Rules of Professional Responsibility, as well as the *Schultz* decision, I am issuing the following statement regarding allegations of improprieties or irregularities in the Brazoria County jury assembly process.

Over the course of several months, the grand jury investigated this matter. Grand jurors reviewed the physical evidence and all applicable criminal and civil law. Moreover, they listened to the testimony of the Texas Ranger who led the investigation, as well as numerous witnesses and experts.

After careful deliberation and consideration of the law and evidence, the Grand Jury declined to charge anyone with a crime in this matter.

Accordingly, the matter is concluded.
