Prison Rape Elimination Act 2022-2023 Annual Report

The Brazoria County Juvenile Justice Department (BCJJD) is dedicated to meeting the requirements of the Prison Rape Elimination Act (PREA) of 2003 and the department seeks to improve and continually refine safety and security practices for all BCJJD detainees as a result thereof. This report is a summary of the agency's efforts in PREA compliance. By compiling, reviewing and implementing corrective actions based on agency data relating to sexual abuse and sexual harassment the BCJJD seeks to increase the effectiveness of sexual abuse and sexual harassment prevention, detection, response, investigations, monitoring technology, area examinations, staffing levels, trainings, policies and procedures.

Purpose:

This document serves as an annual review to assess and improve the effectiveness of sexual abuse and sexual harassment prevention, detection, and response while examining policies, practices, systems and training in the Brazoria County Juvenile Justice Department (BCJJD), pursuant to \$115.388 and \$115.389 of the national PREA standards. Therein, BCJJD is required to:

- Review and aggregate incident-based sexual abuse data annually in order to improve the
 effectiveness of sexual abuse prevention, detection and response policies, practices and
 training to include:
 - a. Identifying problem areas;
 - b. Taking corrective action on an on-going basis; and
 - c. Preparing an annual report of its findings
- 2. Compare the current year's data and corrective actions with those from prior year's and provide an assessment of the agency's progress in addressing sexual abuse.
- 3. Publish the annual report on the Brazoria County Juvenile Justice Department website of its findings and corrective actions for the agency as a whole.

Aggregated Data:

The Brazoria County Juvenile Justice Department collects data from both incidents and investigations of sexual abuse and sexual harassment in the following categories: youth-on-youth, youth-on-staff and staff-on-youth. The data in the section below contains aggregated data from CY2022 and CY2023 (Calendar Year = CY) through June 2023.

All sexual abuse and sexual harassment allegations are compiled, reviewed, documented and stored in a secured area. All incidents of abuse are reported to the following agencies: Texas Department of Family and Protective Services, Texas Juvenile Justice Department and local law enforcement authorities. The following table below depicts a breakdown of our 2022-2023 sexual abuse and sexual harassment data as of June 2023 in the following categories: youth-on-youth, youth-on-staff, and staff-on-youth. The data below includes all sexual abuse and sexual harassment allegations from the Brazoria County Juvenile Justice Department.

2022 Annual Facility PREA Report

In 2022, 145 juveniles were admitted to Pegasus. During this period there were 13 reports received:

- 1 Substantiated incident
- 12 Unsubstantiated incidents
- 0 Unfounded incidents
- 0 Incidents reported which were not PREA (investigated & ruled out)
- 0 Incidents reported which were determined to constitute non-abusive contact

in 2021, 148 juveniles were admitted to Pegasus. During this period there were 5 reports received:

- 1 Substantiated incident
- 4 Unsubstantiated incidents
- 0 Unfounded incidents
- 0 Incidents reported which were not PREA (investigated & ruled out)
- 0 Incidents reported which were determined to constitute non-abusive contact

In 2020, 137 juveniles were admitted to Pegasus. During this period there were 5 reports received:

- 0 Substantiated incidents
- 3 Unsubstantiated incidents
- 2 Unfounded incidents
- 0 Incidents reported which were not PREA (investigated & ruled out)
- 0 Incidents reported which were determined to constitute non-abusive contact

In 2019, 186 juveniles were admitted to Pegasus. During this period there were 11 reports received:

- 1 Substantiated incident
- 5 Unsubstantiated incidents
- 4 Unfounded incidents
- 1 Incident reported which was not PREA (investigated & ruled out)
- 0 Incidents reported which were determined to constitute non-abusive contact

There were 12 unsubstantiated incidents in 2022:

There were twelve unsubstantiated incidents in 2022. Although unsubstantiated, corrective actions were taken that included additional training regarding blind spots, reminding staff to remain fully alert and attentive during duty hours, and additional cameras in multiple buildings. However, all staff were reminded regularly about the rights of children in care.

There was 1 substantiated incident in 2022:

There was 1 substantiated incident in 2022, and one corrective action as a result. The corrective action was additional emphasis on employees remaining alert and attentive during duty hours.

2022 Annual Facility PREA Report

Corrective action plans occur following every substantiated incident, and some unsubstantiated incidents where measures can be taken that can improve safety. Typical corrective action plans include:

- Additional training on visual supervision practices, or a change in supervision practices, to include increased supervision efforts particularly in regard to blind spots
- Identification of barriers to adequate supervision and strategies to mitigate
- Safety Contracts for the juveniles
- Sanctions for juveniles identified to have engaged in sexual misconduct
- If appropriate, contact with law enforcement and/or human resources

Actions to improve outcomes during 2022:

Pegasus continues to make the safety of residents and staff a priority. In-depth PREA training, including responsibilities and support options, is required for every new employee and resident with refresher training provided regularly. Fourteen (14) additional cameras were installed in multiple buildings to reduce blind spots and improve supervision capabilities.
