PROCEDURES FOR SETTING CIVIL MATTERS IN THE 412TH DISTRICT COURT

THE CIVIL TRIAL DOCKET

TRIAL SESSIONS:

The Court will schedule certain weeks for civil trials. This schedule is posted on the court's website. All cases are number one on the docket until the Judge assigns the trial order. All Counsel are to be present at the docket call the morning their case is set for trial.

A week prior to your trial date, the Judge requires the parties to exchange Witness Lists, Exhibit Lists, proposed Jury Charge, and Motions in Limine. The Judge also requires the parties to confer about these 4 items prior to Pre-Trial.

All Pre-Trial Motions must be scheduled with the court coordinator to be heard no later than 12:00 noon on the Friday preceding the trial date. Except on leave of Court, no motions will be heard on day of trial.

SETTINGS:

All requests for trial settings may be set by an attorney of record or by the Court. The requests for trial setting must be in writing, and approved by the court coordinator. A Docket Control Order signed by the attorneys will **not** get your case set for trial. Your trial date must be approved by the Court. If you do not have a Docket Control Order, you must send a Trial Setting Request including the following information:

- 1. Number and style of case;
- 2. Month requested and the docket call date for said month;
- 3. Specify whether the case is jury or non-jury;
- 4. Certification that pleadings are in order, discovery is complete, requesting attorney has no conflicting settings and that settlement has been attempted;
- 5. Certification that each attorney of record has been served with a copy of the request for trial setting.

The forms for Docket Control Orders and Trial Setting Requests for the 412th District Court are available on the court's website.

AGREED PASS:

The 412^{th} District Court does not let counsel pass trial dates by agreement. Cases filed in the 412^{th} can <u>only</u> be passed by the Judge of that court.

PREFERENTIAL TRIAL SETTING:

Cases may be set preferably by motion to the Judge setting forth specific grounds of good cause for such request. A hearing is required.

DISMISSAL DOCKET:

All cases pending more than eighteen (18) months will be placed on a "Try or Dismiss" docket, docket call to be announced.

THE CIVIL ANCILLARY DOCKET

SETTINGS:

Requests for hearing motions and other ancillary civil matters shall be made by telephone, in writing, or by e-mail to the Court Coordinator who will set the matter for an available day and time in accordance with the court's schedule. The requesting attorney must give proper written notice to all opposing counsel of such setting.
