





As we discussed over the phone, the City of Sweeny's WWTP project is nearly complete and a few critical items have come up during construction. While the Contractor was performing the work, two of the channel gates between the Aeration Basin and the Final Clarifiers failed. Also, the existing v-notch weirs around the clarifiers are out of level, which leads to "short circuiting" which prevents the treatment unit from performing correctly. These two issues are related to the work being done as part of the TxCDBG project, but were unforeseen until we were midway through construction.

Additionally, the City of Sweeny recently received a letter from the TCEQ documenting the problems with the gates and clarifiers. The TCEQ has required that the City repair these issues as soon as possible. I have been in contact with the Contractor and he has submitted some pricing for doing the work as part of his contract. On behalf of the City, we would like to request that additional funds in the amount of \$22,000 be allocated for this additional work.

The work is critical to maintain compliance with the TCEQ and can be done in a timely manner with the Contractor currently working at the plant. We ask for your favorable consideration of this additional funding. If you have any questions, please don't hesitate to call.


