INFORMATION REGARDING PROBATION REVIEW PROGRAM

Who has to attend?

All persons granted community supervision (probation) in the 239th District Court.

However, the following probationers are exempt from appearing:

- 1. Probationers ordered to attend SAFTF (Substance Abuse Felony Treatment Facility) or a CRTC (Community Residential Treatment Center) as a condition of probation.
- 2. Probationers who are allowed to transfer their probation out-of-state pursuant to an Interstate Compact.

Who can Excuse me from attending?

Only the Judge of the 239th District Court – Judge Sebesta.

What happens if I fail to appear?

A warrant will be issued for your arrest.

Do I need to hire an attorney to represent me?

You may retain counsel to be present with you at the review date; however, the Court will have an attorney, who is a member of the local bar and practices criminal law, present to assist you. Your present court-appointed counsel is not required to appear.

What will happen at my review date?

The judge will review a report from your supervising probation officer to determine if you have complied with all your conditions of probation.

What could happen to me at my review date?

It depends on whether you have complied with all your terms of probation. The Court could amend your conditions of probation either by awarding incentives (e.g. reducing community service hours) or imposing sanctions. The Court could also order that either the Probation Department or the District Attorney's Office file either a Motion to Revoke or Motion to Adjudicate.
